
the school district, HANNA's Pantry is an affiliate of the Central Pennsylvania Food

The Beginning of Midget Football in Susquehanna Township

Beginning in 1977, 42 years ago, it was discovered that we were the only community in the area that did not have a midget football team, even though there was a perfectly, really good football field, including lights, just lying idle. It was the old high school field behind the now Middle School. Presently, there is very little of it left. The permanent bleachers are long gone, even the running track has been torn up.

At the time, it was said that the residents around the field would object to any activity on the field on a Sunday. So we inquired, knocking on each of their doors to find if this might be true.

Almost unanimously, there was a positive response. There were only two homeowners that objected. One objected for religious reasons, and one was just against anything taking place there.

So where do we go from here? Just solve one problem at a time.

Next problem. We were told that the School Board would not allow us to use the field. So we contacted the School Board and learned that they were elated with the idea and offered to help wherever they could. We now had a beautiful field with all of its facilities, just begging to be used. Later, the School Board went so far as to arrange for us to make use of a 60' house trailer, which we used as equipment storage and a first aid station.

Next problem was the football equipment. Where do we find it? Shenk & Tittle, a since closed sporting goods store, gave us credit for whatever we needed. Over \$10,000 (a lot of money back then) worth of shoulder pads, helmets, uniforms and other items we needed.

How to get the word out that a team was being formed in the township? We enlisted help from people including Bucky Weaver, Don Gates, Dick & Charlotte Enders, Don Tinsman, and many others who were interested in our young people. As they say, "People just came out of the wood work". It was unbelievable how it happened but we ended up with three full teams and cheerleaders. More than 90 youth were involved. I have never seen anything like it in the township ever before.

The next problem? Starting a team in the township would mean taking players from Penbrook, our neighboring borough.

We attended their football team board meeting, explaining what we wanted to do. They weren't happy about it, but they understood. Any youth who lived in the township who wished to leave Penbrook to come over and play on our team, could do so.

Just who do we play?

In the beginning, of course, all of our Sundays were free. Our means of competing with other teams was relatively easy. It didn't take very long to get a full schedule. Making use of the lights at our field, we were even able to schedule a few night games. Again, the School Board gave us their full cooperation.



We set up a governing body of volunteers. After seeing other board meetings and how problems were created, not solved, people shouting and acting childlike, we settled our problems in a civil, democratic way and got things done.

We maintained the team by making use of the concession stand, which was already there. Profits from the sale of food, beverages, and the sale of occasional sub sandwiches was enough to keep us going.

The "Standing" of the teams were quite remarkable; we always did well as far as the league was concerned, but for some unknown reason not one of our players ever went on to play high school sports. We did one thing, of which we were most proud. We accomplished our goal of giving every child a chance to play in every game. There was some controversy about having a winning team, or letting the lesser skilled kids play. In the end, it worked out to everyone's satisfaction.

As far as problems were concerned, we had very little issues with the young people. Most of the problems came from the parents.

The program has since developed into quite an operation and is a source of great pride for those of us who were there in the beginning.


