Bermudian's Dave McCollum becomes winningest wrestling coach in District 3 history

When Dave McCollum took over as Bermudian Springs wrestling coach in the 1970s, he made a point to measure his program against the one at Hanover High School.

That's because Hanover was coached by Terry Conover, the most respected coach in the area.

It's taken 42 years, but McCollum has finally surpassed the legendary Conover.

McCollum became the winningest wrestling coach in District 3 history Wednesday night when the Eagles topped Hanover, 72-6, at home to give him a career record of 573-206-3. He passed Conover, who finished with 572 wins in a career that included 37 years at Hanover from 1971 to 2007.

"When I first started, Terry was the guy in this area and I have so much respect for what he accomplished," McCollum said. "To surpass a record that he held for quite a while is pretty special."

McCollum is fourth in PIAA wrestling history behind Carl Schnellenbach (Ridley), Ron Kanaski (Danville) and Bill Sexton (Towanda). The late Schnellenbach finished with a whopping 746 wins.

The longtime Bermudian coach — affectionately nicknamed "Mouse" — hasn't just racked up wins during his career. He's turned Bermudian Springs into a local powerhouse since taking over during the 1977-78 season as just the second coach in school history.

Under McCollum's guidance, the Eagles have won 11 YAIAA division titles since joining the league in 2004-05, often dominating the competition in Division III. They've appeared in the District 3 Class 2A team title match nine times, winning championships in 2000, 2004 and 2008.

Additionally, Bermudian wrestlers have won 37 District 3 individual titles under McCollum's tutelage, stretching from Rich Lenker's 112-pound title in 1978 to Chase Dull's 195-pound championship last season.

Still, the accomplishments McCollum holds most dear are those at the state level. Three of his competitors — Trevor Byers (119 pounds, 1986), Rickey Schmelyun (140 pounds, 2006) and Tristan Sponseller (195 pounds, 2014) — have won individual state titles. The Eagles reached the PIAA team championship match in 2008, losing to Burrell, 37-29, at Giant Center.

"That was a fairy tale season and a spectacular match," McCollum said. "The community support has been fantastic and it's just a great environment to coach."

It's also the only place McCollum has ever coached.

He was still looking for a job the August after graduating from Bloomsburg in 1977 when a friend saw the opening at

Bermudian and suggested he apply. As McCollum put it, he was "really lucky" to get hired.

There were fewer than 10 wrestlers on the team at a time, a number that has grown exponentially over the years. While other small schools have struggled to field full lineups in recent years, Bermudian has always enjoyed strong participation.

"We have a strong wrestling community, but he's played a big part in building that," Bermudian athletic director Dave Orwig said. "He's very humble. The amount of time he puts in is incredible and he genuinely cares and the kids and their families, from the top kids all the way down.

"It's a privilege to work alongside him and he's just a genuinely good person."

Additionally, McCollum is an assistant high school football coach at Bermudian and was a math teacher in the middle school before retiring a few years ago.

He graduated from Susquehanna Township (in 1973) and went on to wrestle at Bloomsburg, serving as team captain his senior year.

It was his freshman year of college that his now well-known nickname was given to him by his teammate, NCAA Division I champion Floyd "Shorty" Hitchcook.

"I walked in the wrestling room and he said, 'Hahaha, look at that mouse," McCollum said. "I was short and my ears stuck out."

McCollum isn't thinking of retirement just yet. He's got another talented Bermudian team this season with 11 returning starters and is off to a 2-0 start.
